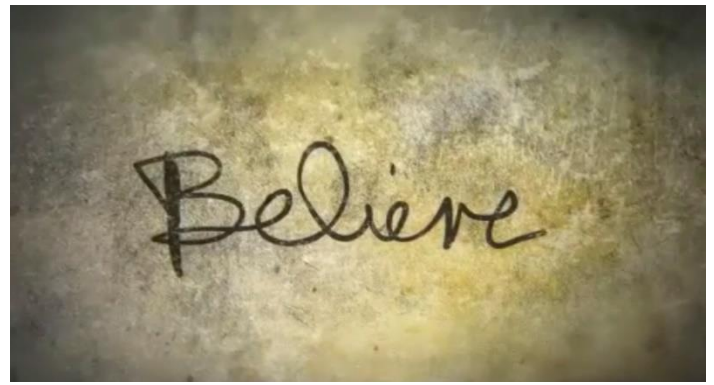
Web Cam Daily Mass during Covid-19
