COVID-19 Support Line for Older People

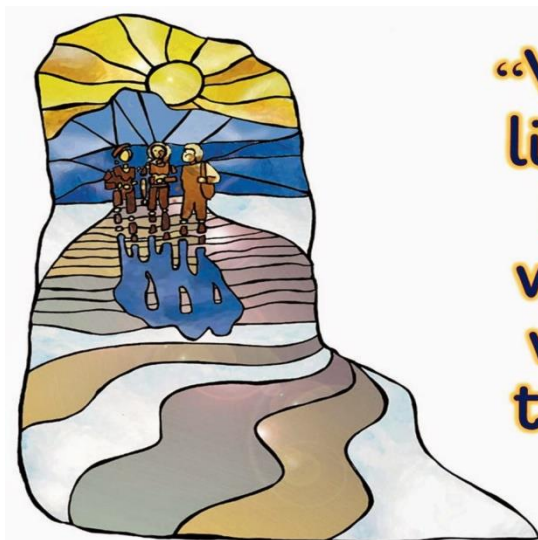
