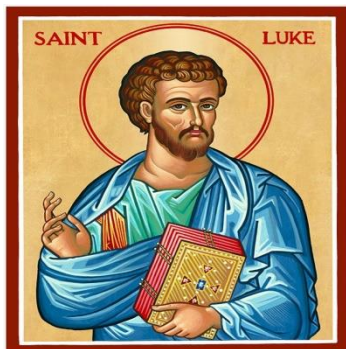

Update on the Further Reopening of Churches

With the announcement of the relaxation of more of the Public Health Guidelines that allows for 50% capacity in attendance of parishioners at Mass, the following changes can take place in the churches of our Parish.

These changes will be revised on the 22nd October, in line with Government Guidelines.

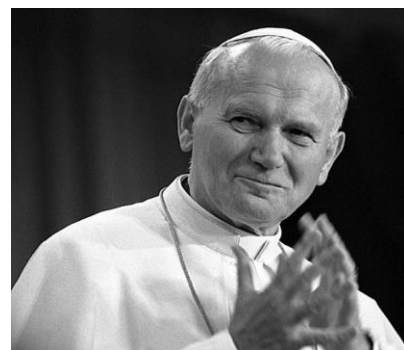


FEASTS THIS WEEK

POPE JOHN PAUL II

St John Paul II was pope for over twenty -six years from 22nd October 1978 until his death on 2nd of April 2005. He was ordained a Bishop of Krakow in 1958 and took a significant part in the Second Vatican Council. As Bishop of Rome he visited almost all of the Roman Parishes and made apostolic journeys to 104 countries, including Ireland from the 29th of September to the 2nd of October 1979.
