Solemnity of All Saints - 1st November

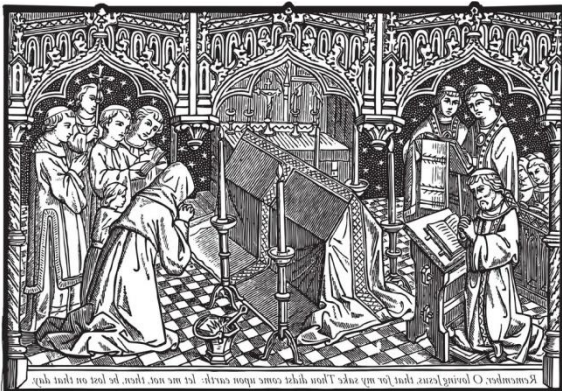

Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls) - 2nd November



All Souls Day is an invitation for the Faithful on earth to pray for the souls of the Faithful Departed that they may attain the eternal life of heaven. The prayers offered to God to have mercy on the souls of the dead, to purify them by the fire of His charity, and to bring them into His Kingdom of life and light, find particular expression in the life of the Christian Faithful, filled as it with the hope of being reunited one day in heaven, and in charity in assisting our Beloved Deceased on their perfection by grace. "It is a good and holy thought to pray for the dead - 2Macc12:46). Not only do our prayers assist the Faithful Departed, but offer comfort to the Bereaved in their grief at the passing of a Loved One. There will be two Masses offered on All Souls Day;

9:30am in St John the Baptist's, Clonalvy
7:30pm in St Andrew's, Curraha

November - Month of the Holy Souls. Expressions of faith and Christian Piety throughout the month of November include: Writing a List of family members, friends, neighbours who have died so that they may be included in the prayers offered throughout the year for the Parish List of the Dead. The list can be dropped into the box in the Church or left into the Sacristy. Visiting a cemetery during November and praying for all interred there. Making a visit to someone who has been Bereaved to offer support and an opportunity to talk.

Norms for the Indulgences for All Souls

1. From 12 Noon on 1st Nov to Midnight on 2nd Nov, all who have confessed (within 8 days), received Holy Communion, and prayed for the Pope's Intentions, and visiting a Church (praying an Our Father and the Apostles Creed), a Plenary Indulgence is gained, applicable to the Faithful Departed.
2. The Faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the Dead may gain a plenary indulgence, once per day, with the usual conditions (Confession, Holy Communion, Prayers for the Holy Father), from the 1st to the 8th Nov. for the Faithful Departed.
