2nd Sunday of Easter

The Sunday that follows Easter Sunday goes by many titles. It's often referred to as 'Low Sunday' in the Easter Octave, in comparison to the 'height' of Easter Sunday, last week. Traditionally, it



was the day, that the newly baptised stopped wearing their white garments, which they had assumed the week previous at the Easter Vigil, and was called "Dominica in Albis -White Sunday". The opening words of Mass - 'Like newborn infants', again referring to the newly baptised, is the translation of the Latin "*Quasi modo geniti infantes*" and so the Sunday was often called "Quasimodo" Sunday. Victor Hugo's character of the Hunchback of Notre Dame was named



Quasimodo because he was found on this Sunday in the book. In more recent times, it has become now as Divine Mercy Sunday that ends the Novena of Divine Mercy, given to St Faustina. The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy is a staple of many parishioner's prayers and is a highly commendable practice. "O blood and water, which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a fountain of mercy for us, I trust in You".



However you know this Sunday, rejoice for it is the day of the Lord!

Sunday Mass - an 'Essential Service' to the Lord

Statement of the Irish Bishops: From the beginning of Easter, attending Sunday Mass will once again be deemed an essential expression of faith for all in our Church in Ireland. As always, those whose health is vulnerable or who are unwell will not be under any obligation to attend Mass and should keep themselves safe and pray at home until they are better.

Catechism of the Catholic Church - on the Sunday Obligation:

2181 The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist (Mass) on Sundays and on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin.

2182 Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together they testify to God's holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
