Thank you for your generous support with the running costs of our parish.

Charity Tax Back Form (CHY3) – If you have donated over €250 a year (about €5 a week), the parish, as part of a charity, can claim a tax rebate on your donation, up to 45% which allows your donation to go further. At the moment, we are corresponding with parishioners in Ardcath/Clonalvy who have reached this threshold and are asking to sign the CHY3 form and return as soon as possible. Your donation will be worth an additional 44.93%. So if you donate €250, we can claim €112.33 tax back from Dept of Revenue – meaning your original donation is worth €362.33. The Tax rebate won't cost you a penny in tax or affect your tax status in any way. Forms will be sent out by the end of next week.

Meath Diocese Pilgrimage to Knock on 14th August 2022.

The Meath Diocese pilgrimage to Knock will be renewed this year and will take at the start of the Knock Novena on Sunday 14th August. The Pilgrimage will be led by Bishop Thomas Deenihan and we will be accompanied by the Kilbeg Parish Choir and Friends. The Anointing of the Sick takes place in the Basilica at 2.30pm and Mass is at 3.00pm. The Rosary procession will follow outside on the grounds of the Shrine, weather permitting.
