Dates for the Celebration of the Sacraments 2024

The **Sacrament of Confirmation** will be celebrated in **St Andrew's Church, Curraha** on **Fri, 23rd Feb 2024**.

The celebration of God's mercy in the sacrament of **First Confession** will take place:

St Andrew's Church, Curraha 7:30pm 29th February 2024

Our parish will celebrate the children of our Parishes receiving the Lord Jesus Christ in the sacrament of **First Holy Communion**:

St Andrew's Church, Curraha 10:30pm 18th May 2023

St. Mary's Church, Ardcaith 12:30am 18th May 2023

Next weekend, the children preparing to receive the Sacraments of First Penance and First Holy Communion next year will reflect on their baptism, as the moment they became children of God and opens us up to the sacramental life. We keep all our young parishioners in prayer.

November List of the Dead: As the month of the Holy Souls approaches, parishioners are asked to prepare their family List of the Dead for prayers throughout November, and the First Friday of the Month. The List of the Dead envelope can be found in the Parish Offertory Envelopes Box.

Annual Masses for the Bereaved: Families of Parishioners who have passed away since last November are invited to the Annual Masses for the Bereaved which will take place over the weekend of the 4th/5th November.



Altar Servers: We are welcoming children from 3rd class and upwards who would like to become altar servers. Application forms are available in the Sacristy and Parish Office. The ministry of altar server is an important one in the celebration of the liturgy, that also allows children

to grow in the knowledge of the faith and it's practice. Training dates will take place as soon as the applications forms have been submitted.

October - Month of the Holy Rosary. October is given as a month to renew and refresh devotion to the Rosary as both a personal and a family prayer. The daily habit of praying the rosary helps us to grow in our love of the Lord Jesus, brings us closer to the life of heaven, and overcomes many of the difficulties that can sap the joy of faith. Take this annual invitation to pray the rosary once again.



Mission Sunday: (22nd October) is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October. World Mission Sunday collections take place in every single parish where the Church is present. This includes not only Ireland and Europe, but also in poorer parishes in developing countries. It is a moment of universal solidarity when each member of the Church family, regardless of location or background, play their part in supporting

each other. This is what makes it such a special celebration. Envelopes for donations will be available in the church, and can be returned in the collection, to the sacristy or to the parish office.
