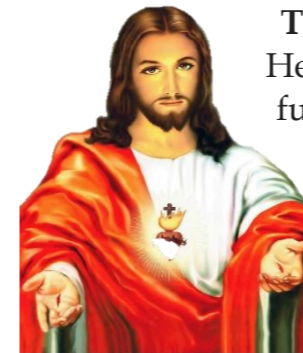
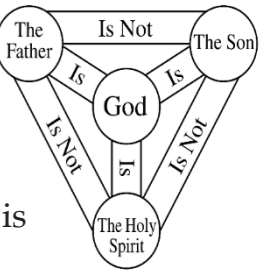

The Solemnity of Most Holy Trinity- Trinity Sunday The faith of all Christians rests on the Trinity – One God in three Divine Persons, "Christians are baptized in the **name** of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: not in their names, for there is only one God, the almighty Father, his only Son and the Holy Spirit: the **MOST HOLY TRINITY.**" The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the "hierarchy of the truths of faith". The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the "mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God". It is a mystery not in the sense of beyond understanding, but of something hidden and revealed by God to us. To be sure, God has left traces of his Trinitarian being in his work of creation and in his Revelation throughout the Old Testament. But his inmost Being as Holy Trinity is a mystery that is inaccessible to reason alone or even to Israel's faith before the Incarnation of God's Son and the sending of the Holy Spirit. "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen



The Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. June is dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus as a way of deepening our awareness of the Lord's love for us and furthering our devotion to His heart. The Sacred heart was once the mainstay of family devotion and a source of blessing for many homes as the Image of the Lord was enthroned in the home, with the names of the family inscribed underneath, and many remembrance cards placed wedged into the sides. Corpus Christi Procession

We hope to honour the Most Blessed Sacrament and seek God's blessing on our parishes through a Corpus Christi Procession after Mass on the weekend of 2nd/3rd June – the Feast of Corpus Christi in St Mary's Church, Ardcath after the Vigil Mass at 6:30pm and in St Andrew's Church, Curraha after the 11:30am Mass. Our young parishioners who recently received First Holy Communion are particularly invited to process in their First Communion suits and dresses. Flower Petals to be laid in front of the Most Blessed Sacrament during the procession can be collected and given in before Mass. We know Christ is truly and substantially present in Holy Communion, and so the tradition of a procession with the Blessed Sacrament reminds us of our journey in life and faith, walking with Jesus truly present with us, His people who seek His divine providence over our homes and hearts.
