Cemetery Devotions Summer 2024


Ardcath on **Sunday, 10**th **September**. We continue to pray for all on the Parishes Lists of the Dead at Mass on the First Friday of the Month.

LIKE SHEEP WITHOUT A SHEPHERD.



Jesus is the Messiah who came into the world to give his life as a ransom for many. He did not come to be served but to serve giving his life daily for the welfare of humanity. Hence, scripture teaches that Jesus is the good shepherd who gives his life for his sheep.

In the first Reading, the prophet Jeremiah proclaims doom upon the shepherds of Israel that fail to care for the sheep entrusted to them, allowing them to be scattered and destroyed. This is contrary to the action of Jesus Christ and his disciples in the gospel of today. They
