

Antidote to the 7 Ps of Pride: Praise, Power, Profits, Position, Prestige, Possessions and Pleasure.



What we possess is not who we are. Yet we often make what we possess who we are, and allow our position, profits, prestige, praise, power, pride and pleasure to define us. The more we have of these, the more we elevate ourselves in our own mind and are critical of others who have less of these than us. This is how the culture we live in operates. We think that those who have more of the 7 Ps are more successful, and somehow better than those who have less. To completely break out of this

paradigm is not easy, and I don't claim to be perfect in it. But one thing that helps me is remembering the lessons from the loaves and remembering that I came with no bread. Everything good that I have is a gift from God. If I am ever tempted to take pride in the 7 Ps in my life, I just need to remember I would have nothing if it weren't for the grace and mercy of Jesus Christ. Everything good in my life can be traced back to his gifts to me. To be like a child is this: everything is a gift!

I don't think having the 7 P's is the problem, it is when they are the motive that they become the problem. Christ taught to seek first the kingdom of God, and the things we need will be added to us. I am really trying to learn how to do this more fully, and completely let go of needing any of the 7 Ps to feel successful. This is the antidote: to be like a child!
