The celebrations will take place at St. Mary's Church, Ardcath, at 11am on Saturday, 16th May 2026, and at St. Andrew's Church, Curraha, at 11am on Saturday, 23rd May 2026. **PILGRIMAGE:** Celebrating the Franciscan Jubilee Year, Bishop Deenihan will lead a Meath diocesan pilgrimage to Padua, Loreto, Venice and Assisi from 26 September for five nights. Pilgrims will visit major shrines including St Anthony's Basilica, the Holy House of Loreto, San Damiano, the Basilica of Saint Francis, and the tomb of Carlo Acutis. The pilgrimage includes flights, transfers and half-board accommodation. Cost €1,335. Bookings are through Joe Walsh Tours nationwide now.

**THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER** is known by many rich and historic titles. Traditionally called *Low Sunday*, *White Sunday (Dominica in Albis)*, and *Quasimodo Sunday*, it marked the completion of the Easter Octave for the newly baptised. In recent times, it is celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday, concluding the Divine Mercy Novena. Whatever its name, it remains a joyful proclamation of the Risen Lord. Alleluia.



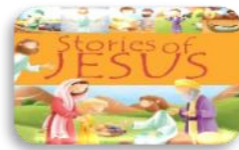

**BLESSING OF THE GRAVES 2026:** Parishioners are warmly invited to join us for the annual Blessing of the Graves, a cherished time of prayer and remembrance. Ceremonies will take place at Piercetown (27 June), Clonalvy (28 June), Curragha, Crickstown and Kilmoon (5 July), Kilbrew (6 July), and Ardcath (13 September). We remember our loved ones with faith, hope, and gratitude for their lives.

**THE EASTER OCTAVE,** from Easter Sunday to the Second Sunday of Easter, is a joyful eight-day celebration in which each day is marked as Easter Day. The wider Season of Easter then continues for fifty days, until Pentecost, proclaiming Christ's Resurrection with the constant acclamation of *Alleluia*. This sacred season invites us to share Easter joy in prayer, liturgy, and daily life, rejoicing together in the Risen Lord.
